PLACEMENT EXAMINATION AND COURSE PLANNING

Completing the Analytical Writing Placement Exam (AWPE) is particularly important for students to do prior to orientation. In order to enroll in the appropriate English course for Fall 2024, you must have an English Placement. To meet UC admission requirements, all UC students must meet the Entry Level Writing Requirement (ELWR). The remaining placement exams can be found here.

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MATHEMATICS ADVISORY EXAM (MAE)

The School of Education (SOE) strongly encourages all incoming first-years to register for the Mathematics Advisory Exam (MAE) regardless of their expected AP/IB results. Courses in Math, Science, Engineering, Computer Science, Psychology, Neuroscience, Business, Economics, and Health preparation courses will require a specific mathematics level as a prerequisite.

If you successfully completed mathematics at a Community College or at a 4-year institution, and it articulates to a UC Riverside mathematics course (Assist.org), then you will not need to register for the Mathematics Advisory Exam (MAE) exam. Please be sure to officially report all AP/IB scores and transfer coursework to UCR Undergraduate Admissions.

We highly encourage new students to finalize their math placement by July 12th, 2024. Students will be allowed a 2nd proctored attempt and all students who place into Math 3 are strongly encouraged to take the 2nd proctored attempt.

For students planning to enroll in their first UCR math course this Summer 2024, the July 12th deadline will guarantee meeting the registration deadlines for <u>Highlander Early Start Academy</u> (HESA).

FOREIGN LANGUAGE PLACEMENT

The exam will need to be taken by every UC Riverside student, regardless of AP/IB score and credit. Examination appointments are available starting Summer 2024. (Sign up here).
