What is a Bilingual Authorization?

• A *Bilingual Authorization* (BILA) is the authorization necessary to teach in a language other than English in California schools.







What are the options a BILA can provide me?

 You can teach in a dual language immersion (DLI) program in the partner language (e.g., Spanish) and in English.

 You can teach in an English-only program (e.g., Mainstream English, Structured English

Immersion).







What are the benefits of earning a BILA?

- Teachers with a BILA are in great demand across the nation, including California, and especially in
- Often, there is a stipend for teachers who have a BILA and are teaching in a DLI program.

the Inland Empire.

• Teachers with a BILA teaching in a DLI program are put on a separate seniority list in the event of a reduction-in-force (RIF) layoff situation.

How do I earn a BILA?

There are three (3) different routes:

- Take the UCR Spanish Proficiency Assessment (SPA) or the CSET Subtest III – (Test Code 147; Spanish language proficiency) and EDUC179B/EDUC286 (along with your other credential courses) to cover CSET tests IV & V
- 2. Take all three (3) CSET tests
 - Subtest III Test Code 147 (Spanish language proficiency) or the UCR SPA
 - Subtest IV

 Test Code 250 (Bilingual methodology; not specific to any language)
 - **Subtest V** Test Code 258 (Hispanic culture [covers all Spanish-speaking cultures])

How do I earn a BILA?

- 3. Take CSET Subtest III Test Code 147 and courses at UCR Extension to cover CSET tests IV and V
 - There are 4 asynchronous (online) courses, which take one full calendar year to complete.
- <u>Please note</u>: There are costs associated with each CSET test and UCR Extension course.
- Each route also requires a <u>minimum number of hours</u> student teaching in Spanish.
- If you are seeking a Single Subject credential (in any content area) and have a BA in Spanish, you do not have to take CSET Subtest III or the SPA!
