

The Education, Society, and Human Development major offers to any undergraduate student an introduction to issues, policies, and practices of education and research in schools, and learning across contexts.

This concentration prepares you to acquire an interdisciplinary understanding of research, theories, and practices that contribute to human development, learning, and behavior in the field of education.
