Student Life Leadership Certificate Starting Fall 2018

- All leadership programs including the Inspiring R' Leaders Conference and the Cultural Awareness Project count toward the completion of the certificate.
 - R' Leaders Conference a one-day conference that provides opportunities for UCR students to evaluate and recognize their leadership skills and abilities. Approximately 20 workshops will be offered within various themes ranging from communication, diversity and social justice, leadership assessments, self-awareness and identity development.
 - Cultural Awareness Project (CAP) a four-week program with a two-hour workshop each week. Each workshop addresses different topics to build your cultural competence.
 - You will learn how to collaborate with people from different cultures and backgrounds, how to help ALL students feel welcome on campus, and how your own identity shapes your experience.
