

Catalog 2020: Updated 4/13/2021

The Education Minor consists of the satisfactory completion of 24 EDUC units, with a minimum of 16 units coming from the upper division EDUC coursework. Candidates must be in good academic standing at time of review.

For Petition Eligibility:

By the end of junior year, passing letter grades in two education courses, unique to the Minor in Education, are required. Minor must be approved and posted to your degree prior to submitting any College Graduation Application (view [term deadlines: http://registrar.ucr.edu/graduation-guide/deadline](http://registrar.ucr.edu/graduation-guide/deadline)).

- CNAS requires completion of two upper-division education courses to initiate petition process.
- For all other colleges - a minimum of two education courses (lower and/or upper-division) will be accepted.

Course overlap unit restriction: An education course may be used to fulfill either a major or minor program requirement, not both.

At least 16 out of the 24 required units must be from upper-division EDUC units. The following courses are accepted toward completion of the Minor in Education.
